FATAL ACCIDENT.

Young Man Meets With Fatal Accident While At Work In Hay Field.

William Matland, a young Scotchman working on the big East Butte ranch of Laird Brothers, met with a fatal accident while performing his duties last Thursday.

It seems he was driving a team attached to a hay wagon, the horses becoming frightened started to run away, Matland jumped from the wagon and in making a short turn it run over him, injuring him internally, causing death early Monday morning.

The remains were brought to Chester and interred in the new grave yard on Tuesday afternoon, Rev. Colyn officiating.

The young man came to this country about two years ago and leaves a brother, also an employe of Laird Brothers, besides relatives in Scotland.

John Osler Dead.

John Osler died Monday afternoon, at the Deaconess' hospital in Great Falls, from the effects of the terrible exposure he suffered in going home, from Chester, Thanksgiving day, when in company with his wife; daughter, Mrs Vaver and two children, and son George, became lost and remained out over the coldest night of the winter.

After two weeks of intense suffering he was taken to the hospital, where all of his toes were amputated; the shock and his advanced age proved to be more than he could endure and death relieved him.

Mr Osler was born near Breckin, Forfarshire, Scotland, 66 years ago was married to Mary Keith, a sister of the Keith Brothers of Alma, in 1880 and eight years later they came to America, settling in western Minnesota and about four years ago the family moved to Montana, taking up land near Alma, where they have a good ranch.

Mr Osler was a gentleman of the old school, honest to a degree and generous to a fault; the community in which he lived has lost a friend indeed.

Besides his wife, Mr Osler leaves two sons, George and John, two daughters, Mrs John Vaver and Mrs John McDowell all living near home, and two brothers and a sister in Scotland.

The body reached Chester yesterday morning and the funeral will be held this afternoon at 3 o'clock, interment in the new grave yard a short distance east of town.

Benton Child Dragged To Death By Pet Calf

Several children were playing "horse" with a pet calf. A long lariat rope was attached to the calf, and the other end to the three year old child. The calf became frightened and ran, dragging the child, and before it could be rescued it was dead. Mr. Rowe is away from home in Illinois.

Mrs. H. S. Boyle, Mr. Rowe's sister, was the only adult person about the place at the time of the accident, and though she made strenuous efforts to rescue the child, life was quite extinct when she succeeded in getting to the little one.
