

Anna Mae Hanson

Anna Mae Hanson (Wolfe) Hanson was born at Whitefish, Montana on August 1st, 1926. She was one of six children born to Daniel and Josephine (Steen) Wolfe. The Wolfe family moved to Chester in 1933. Anna Mae attended school in Chester through her junior year, then transferred to Woodland Hills, California where she graduated from high school in 1944. She returned to Montana to attended nursing school at Bozeman and Great Falls.

On March 23rd, 1946 she married Albert M. Hanson at Great Falls. They lived and worked on the Si Warrington farm south of Chester for several years. In 1950 they

built a home in Chester and have lived here since. Albert farmed in the south Chester community and Anna Mae worked as a farmwife and homemaker for their two children.

Anna Mae's health had been relatively good over the years. Recently, she developed some abdominal problems and was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. For the past week she had been a patient at the Liberty County Hospital in Chester, and she passed away there on Sunday morning, October 13th, 1996. She was 70 years old.

Anna Mae held memberships at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, the Royal Neighbor's of America, and the V.F.W. Auxiliary. She enjoyed working on family histories and was a charter member of the local "Broken Mountain's Genealogical Society." She liked photography and had participated in the "HiLine Shutter Bugs" organization.

Other hobbies included bowling, flower gardening and reading. Anna Mae collected coins, saltand pepper shakers, cut glass and antique dishes. She enjoyed writing poetry and artistic painting. Probably her greatest love was participating in the lives of her grandkids! Last, but not least, Anna Mae was a dedicated caregiver and best friend to her mother over all these years.

Anna Mae is survived by her husband of 50 years, Albert of Chester; a son and daughter-inlaw, Dennis and Glenda Hanson of Chester; a daughter and son-in-law, Sheila and Bruce Peterson of Fort Peck; four grandchildren, including Heather, Heidi, Zak and Lindsey; her mother, Josie Wolfe of Chester; a sister, Maxine Wigen of Chester; four brothers, Delmar, Kenneth, Dean and Roger Wolfe, all of Chester; and numerous nephews and nieces. She was preceded in death by her father.

Funeral services were at 11:00 a.m. (Wednesday, Oct. 16th, 1996) at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Chester with Reverend Tom Dunham officiating. Juanita Wardell serve as organist and Anna Mae's niece, Darlene Abein, sang "Angels Among Us" and "The Lord's Prayer". The congregation sang "The Old Rugged Cross". Pallbearers were her brothers, Delmar, Kenneth, Dean and Roger Wolfe; and friends, Boyd Nealy, Jim Marshall, Gus Fransen and Charley Frey. Ushers were Don Wolfe and Mike Nahrgang. JIM HILL AND RAILROAD

An ambitious Scotchman, Jim Hill, had a dream....to carve out of the "western wasteland" an empire of dry land farms and towns every six miles along his railroad. The railroad came to the Montana borders in 1881 and to this county in 1891. The rails west were started by Minneapolis and Manitoba RR but later it became the Great Northern and Jim Hill was president.

Jim Hill had a spirit of confidence which the workers must have caught from him to be willing to surmount the continuous hardships. During a North Dakota blizzard, Jim Hill picked up his "stiff's" shovel and sent him into the car for hot coffee while he himself shoveled snow as though driven by steam. They suffered the "clouds of mosquitoes that set oxen to bellowing in pain and horses leaping from their harnesses, the blistering sun, rattlesnakes, green scum on the water resulting in dysentery, snow sleet and sleeping in dirty rag tents," so told Lee Howard, who experienced it all. Their goal was a mile a day or Jim Hill got a new slave boss. Is it any wonder they were called "stiffs?"

At times the construction crews were 8,000 men and 3,300 teams for grading. Laying the track and building bridges called for another 225 teams and 650 men. It was estimated over a half million bushels of oats were shipped from Minot for the horses. Jim Turner, an early rancher along the Marias, provided the meat for the crew while the rails were laid through Chester and Galata.

After the rails were laid the depots and post offices "blossomed out like crocous in spring."

UNITED STATES MAIL

For the first settlers, the mail would come from Ft. Benton once or twice a year. James Hamilton and George Bourne who were in the Sweetgrass Hills and thought getting mail once a year a business handicap, so the first post office in now Liberty County was the Whitlash Post Office.

As the homesteaders settled on the sod, women especially, thought it most isolated if they could not get those letters from home and were willing to give up part of their already small kitchen for a post office. Bachelors would come and check on their mail—even though they knew there would be none, but usually were rewarded with a cup of coffee and whatever baking the postmaster was taking out of her oven when the customers came. Homesteader's wives woud walk and "chat" a bit which would break some of the loneliness of a day on the prairie. Newspapers were shared and probably read several times before the owner picked up his weekly. It was one way to know who was elected United States President and if WWI was over.

When the mail "stage" began to make its runs, people could ride out into the country with him, ride to town, or have him bring out a list of supplies and often he was met with a list. The stage driver would be given a hot meal or coffee if he felt he could spare the time on his long route. The first stages were with horses; later the Model T and Model A trucks. And all this service for 2 cents a letter. A stage ride from Chester to Gold Butte was \$4.00, from Joplin to Alma \$2.00.

There were 21 post offices in Liberty County.

Some post offices like Alma, Briggs, Selma and Hill had stores. Alma Village boasted of a school, blacksmith shop and general store, likewise Whitlash.

WHITLASH POST OFFICE

The post office of old Whitlash opened December 3, 1892 and the first post office of the present Liberty County. The postmaster was the founder, George Blake Bourne. Maurice Price became post master October 24, 1893; Hiram Smith, May 6, 1896 and Michael Fitzpatrick, July 14, 1900. The mail came from Ft. Benton until the Great Northern Railroad brought it into Chester.

WHITLASH, MONTANA

1892

Whitlash, Montana came into being, as the first inland Post Office, in the Sweetgrass Hills, in 1892. It had six locations before the present location.

The first Postmaster was George B. Bourne. He received his appointment December 3, 1892. When the application for a post office was sent in, the name Whiplash had been submitted, (so one story was told,), but when it was sent back from Washington D. C., it was Whitlash. Maybe this was due to poor handwriting. The mail was distributed from the home of the appointed Postmaster. Thus the next four or five locations moved to the residence of whomever received the appointment.

Alfred Strode and his cousin Tom Strode, build a townsite on Half Breed

Creek. This consisted of a seven room hotel, a general store, post office, creamery, blacksmith shop, dance hall and saloon. Alfred Strode received the appointment as Postmaster November 27, 1905. This little hamlet thrived until 1918. Fire destroyed part of the buildings, the hotel closed, and F. M. Mack had the store which he closed and moved to Augusta, hauling the merchandise to Galata, where it was shipped by rail. The other buildings were sold, torn down and used elsewhere. The post office was moved a half mile east to the Stott property, when Mrs. Nettie Stott was appointed, March 3, 1918. She held the office until 1928. Mrs. Louisa Allen was appointed October 1, 1928, (later Mrs. Anderson). She served for 46 years until her retirement August, 1974. Karen Kultgen was appointed August 1, 1974, and still acting. Whitlash has been a progressive community. The people were ambitious for their growing families, naturally school was first on the list. The first School District in the Sweetgrass Hills was created by the County Commissioners of Chouteau County, Fort Benton, July 1895. It was 20 miles north and south and 35 miles east and west, and in the northwest part of Chouteau County, Miss Margery Jacobs, County Superintendent. The first school was opened in Gold Butte, September 1895. District 27, Whitlash, was taken out of this district in 1897. School was held in a log cabin west of present day Whitlash. The first school was named Pleasant View School, 1899; teacher was Fanny S. DeLacy. The School Board: C. R.

Keeler, W. A. Carroll and George Murray. The pupils enrolled were: Agnes Carroll, Mamie Carroll, Lois Murray, Edna D. Ellis, Lena Murray, Lottie Amez Doz, Elmer Brown, Mary Fitzpatrick, Amelia Brown, Ada N. Rowe, Edwin Sommer, Robert H. Carroll, Myrtle Ellis, Lynda Rock, Esther Brown,

Harold Brown, Charlie Farrell, and Jessie Rowe.

With an enrollment of this size, the need for a larger building was felt and it was built by John Brown and Lester Stott in 1904. This building was in use and moved about in the district to accommodate the children attending. The building was sold to the Laird District in the 60's when the present school was obtained.

Sunday School and church were held in homes and people would gather at a home with pot luck picnics as distances to and from their homes were far traveling with teams and horseback.

The Presbyterian Church was organized in 1913 by Rev. A.B. Minnemeyer, in the home of Hettie Miller, a sister of Harry Demarest, then living west of him in a log cabin. There were 16 charter members enrolled. Of these, Amelia (Brown) Demarest remains. Church was held in homes and school buildings.

In 1916, the need for a larger community building was felt and the people had Liberty Hall built and paid for by poplar subscription. This building was used for church as well as all other functions. Home talent plays were put on during the winter months, bringing revenue for hall expenses as well as wholesome recreation. Dances were held during the summer and were attended from all around.

Rodeos were a poplular sport and held in Whitlash. Baseball was also a summer sport. There were many games played with the Canadian neighbors as well as other communities.

Along in 1911 or 1912, a barbed wire telephone line was put into operation between the Brown ranches and the Damarests into Whitlash.

The Sweetgrass Hills Telephone Company was formed and a line was built

into Chester, making contact with the Bell Telephone Co. This line was extented to Gold Butte; It remained in operation until Chester went on the dail system. For a few years the Telephone Co. rented a private line into Telstad, connecting with the Shelby exchange until the Rural Telephone Co. built their line in the 1950's.

Drilling for gas and oil has been in progress since 1916 or earlier. There has been considerable production. A pipe line was built into Great Falls in 1930, to supply gas, and another pipeline was built into Cut Bank to carry oil to the refinery there.

Whitlash remained in Chouteau County until 1912, when Hill County was created. In 1914, it was part of Toole County until Liberty County was created out of Hill and Toole County in 1920.

Whitlash has been a United States Custom Port since 1933. The port was located in Whilash until 1969, when it was moved to the border with the Canadian port of Aden across the border. A new building was built at the border in 1974.

HISTORY OF THE HIRAM SMITH FAMILY

He was born in Pleasonton, Kansas. He married Sarah Murray. They migrated to the state of Washington before coming to the Sweetgrass Hills in 1891.

They homesteaded and purchased additional land. They operated this ranch with the help of Pearl Alvord and their nephew Floyd Umphrey.

He served as one of the first School Trustees of District 22, the first school district of the Sweetgrass Hills. The first school was held in Gold

Butte. He served five years.

He was appointed postmaster in 1896 and served until 1900.

He owned one of the early automobiles in the area and unfortunately wrecked it and lost his life.

Mrs. Smith continued to operate the ranch with the help they still had, until her death.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith raised their nephew, Floyd Umphrey. His parents were deceased. Floyd helped his aunt Sarah operate the ranch after Mr. Smith's death. He continued after her death until his untimely death in 1937.

Mrs. Smith described her first rocking chair, made by Mr. Smith using barrel staves for rockers, which she covered with some flowered material, as being a luxury at the time.

She also went to Fort Benton in a lumber wagon to have dental work done.

All giving us an insight to ways of living in their day.

LESTER A. AND NETTIE ALVORD STOTT

Lester born: 10/9/1862, Wis.

Nettie Alvord born: 2/10/1872, Minn.

Children: Ray, Louisa, Ellen, Ruth

Lester A Stott was born in Wisconsin on October 9, 1862, In his youth his family migrated to Brookings, South Dakota. In 1895, the family left by wagon train to come to Montana. They passed within sight of the Sweetgrass Hills on their way to the Flathead Valley, where they settled. In 1892, he met Miss Nettie Alvord during his travels around the country

as a hawker. He was a general handyman, doing shoe repair, carpentry and other odd jobs. He also carried his fiddle along for entertainment. In 1900, after a correspondence courtship, he returned to Minnesota where he and Nettie Alvord were married on Feb. 10 They returned to Kalispell, Montana to make their home. Their son Ray was born there. In the spring of 1903, Mrs. Stott and Ray returned to Minnesota for a visit, and Mr. Stott stopped off in the Sweetgrass Hills to do some prospecting and decided that it might be a good place to settle. In October his wife and son, accompanied by her brother Pearl Alvord, joined him and they settled on Half Breed Creek above the Hiram Smith place. They lived in a two room log house which had dirt floors. After the family started increasing, a pole addition was added and a wooden floor was installed in the kitchen. From their front room window, the Rocky Mountains were visible on a clear day.

John Brown had the contract to build a school house on the old Whitlash townsite, and Lester Stott helped him build it. The building also served as a church until Liberty Hall was built. The school house was moved to several different locations around Whitlash and was finally moved to the Laird District in 1958 and served as their school until the school was discontinued.

Lester Stott worked around the community to get cash to buy staples to augment their diet of wild birds, rabbits, wild fruit and garden produce. He also raised vegetables to trade for groceries in Chester. The vegetables for family use were stored in a root cellar and the surplus were stored in a straw lined pit and then covered with straw and dirt. Later a spring house was built on the creek to store milk, butter and eggs.

Pork was fried down, placed in stone crocks, covered with grease and stored in the spring house. During the Boom of 1910, Lester worked in Chester doing carpentry work. He would take eggs, butter and buttermilk down to sell. Later he built a smoke house, made his own casings and stuffed them with sausage and smoked them for their own use. To make jelly glasses, old beer bottles that had been picked up would have the neck broken off by heating a metal ring and dropping it down over the neck and then immersing the bottle in cold water.

Like most pioneer families, the Stott's took care of their own medical problems. Mrs. Emeline, a half-breed woman who lived to the south of them, assisted at the birth of Louisa and after that Lester assisted with the delivery of the babies. Ray told anyone asking where Louisa came from that they traded a sack of flour for her. Twin boys were born next but neither lived to be a years old. After Ellen was born there were also two daughters who died shortly after birth, and Ruth was their last child. For colds, a few drops of kerosene or turpentine in some lard was rubbed on the chest. A green salve was made of carbolic acid, lard and another substance for cuts, bruises and burns. A spring tonic was made from the bark of the poplar tree brewed in water. For infections, yolk of egg was mixed with salt to make a paste used as a poultice.

When Louisa had her cheek cut open when she was thrown into a barb wire fence, Nettie took her needle and thread to put in several stitches to close the wound.

In the spring 1912, a school was moved from Strawberry Creek to a more central location among the families with school age children and Ray and Louisa started school. As Ray had been taught at home, he took the first

four grades in the four months of summer school. Among those attending school that year were Claude Morris, Leiona Larson, Alice, Hannah and Jim Robinson, Fred and Floyd Hicks, Levi and Lizzie Emeline, and an eighth grade girl who lived on the Cramer place. The first term there were four teachers; Miss Arnt only taught a few days because someone jumped her homestead so she had to live on it. She later became Mrs. Fitzpatrick and was on of the first Superintendent of School in Liberty County. Miss Johnson and Miss Slade followed her and the final teacher for the year was Miss Alrick. She returned to teach the following year. In 1914 Miss Rathmiller taught and Mrs. Short taught the 1915 and 1916 terms. During this time Ellen Stott, Robert and Leionard Robinson, Elbert Hicks, Frankie Larson and Orville Morris had started school.

In the summer of 1915, Nettie Stott assisted Lester Thompson with the store and Post Office. The family moved down in the fall so the children could start school. When they returned to the ranch for Christmas, they got snowed in and couldn't get back to Whitlash until spring. In the spring they purchased land from Harry Demarest on the present site of Whitlash and moved the tar paper shack that they had lived in on the old townsite. They later sold their cattle because the wolves were killing so many and then sold the ranch to Harry Demarest on January 1, 1919. In 1917 Lester Stott started the Rancher's Cash Store building and the family lived in the basement. Nettie Stott was appointed Postmaster March 3, 1918 and served in this office until Oct. 1, 1928 when they moved to Chattaroy, Washington. Lester had a blacksmith shop and had a truck garden. He and Ray also drilled many water well in the vicinity, the first one behind the store building. It was the first artesian well in the hills. On Jan. 1,1924

they sold the store to their daughter and son-in-law, Louisa and Ed (better known as Ted) Allen. Lester passed away at their home in Chattaroy during October of 1937. Nettie and Ray stayed on the place until Ray was drafted into the army in 1942. For a short while her daughter and son-in-law, Ruth and Charley Davis and family lived with her. After that, she went to Dallas, Oregon to be with her daughter Ellen. When Ray received his discharge, he returned to the Sweetgrass Hills to herd sheep for Murray Johnson. In April of 1946, Nettie Stott came back to Whitlash to visit Ray and her daughter, Louisa Anderson and passed away on Easter Sunday, April 21.

In the late 1940's, Ray Stott left the hills and returned to Chattaroy and went to work for Kaiser Aluminum and worked there until he retired. He moved into Spokane to be nearer his work. After he retired, he went to Dallas, Oregon to live with his sister, Ellen Stott McGee and was there until his death July 21, 1968. He had never married.

Ellen Stott McGee still lives in Dallas, Oregon and Ruth Stott Davis has been living in Wickieup, Arizona.
