



WHERE ARE YOUR ROOTS?

Nearly \$\frac{1}{4}\$ of white Americans come from German or Austrian stock, according to the latest figures. Some 24% of our white people trace their roots to Germany or Australia, while 21% of them come from England, Scotland or Wales. 14% come from Ireland, 7% from Scandinavia, 4% from Hispanic nations, 4% from Poland, 3% from France, 3% are native Indians, 2% each from Netherland, Czechoslovakia, dussia, and Canada. 7% of white people come from other nations.


FORCOTTEN??—Jessie ROWE died far from her home at a young age. Could someone still be searching for her burial place?

TOMBSTONE STOLEN

Jessie Rowe was a young girl about 15 years of age when she came to Montana with her sister Ada for her health. Both girls stayed with an uncle, John Umphrey, at his home which was located approximately four miles south of Whitlash, Montana in Liberty County. Legend has it that Jessie died of Consumption. She was buried in the Gold Butte Cemetery which was located about seven miles west of Whitlash, Montana. The inscription on her tombstone was:

"As you are now
So once was I
As I am now
So you must be
So prepare for death
And follow me."

Jessie's tombstone was stolen about seven years ago. Anyone having more information about Jessie or the location of her tombstone is asked to contact a member of the BMGS.

DOES ANYONE KNOW?

Does anyone know who is buried in the Wolf Cemetery? This cemetery is located on the old Chester to Carter Road in Liberty County, Montana. It is approximately four miles west of Skierka's farm and the original Romain home. The only marker that is readable is inscribed with the name, Mary Wolf. However, there are nine other wooden crosses. Angeline Biegonak who died on the third of April in 1921 is also said to have been buried in this cemetery. She was eight days old.

Clarence Romain recalls that he has several infant siblings buried in this cemetery and John Skierka recalls that his mother acted as undertaker on several occasions when people were buried there. He said the only name he remembers the church, which was just west of the cemetery, called was the Wolf Church. It apparently was a Catholic Church and legend has it that in approximately 1938 it was dismantled and the lumber used to enlarge the first St. Mary's Catholic Church in Chester, Montana.

The Wolf Cemetery is cared for by Liberty County. Three wooden crosses are located in the northeast corner of the graveyard. In the southeast corner a rectangular area is ringed with stones and there appears to have been four graves within this area. To the left of the stone enclosure are two more crosses. These, in addition to the one of the infant Mary Wolf, are all that remain visible in this cemetery.

To date little success has been had by the BMGS in finding more information regarding this cemetery. It would seem that any data should be in Havre or Fort Benton since Liberty County was not yet formed. If anyone has any further information about this area, please contact Helen Ann Aaberg, Chester, Montana or any member of the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society.





Surviving Robert, in addition to his wife, Mary CLARK, were his children: Mary Ann b 7 November 1869, Charles b 31 January 1872, Maud b 11 April 1874, Robert b 7 January 1879 and Wayne b 23 February 1881. Robert served with the Illinois Infantry in the Civil War and was a member of the Iowa G. A. R.

James Henry PIMLEY was b 1839 in England m in 1860 to Phebe S. NASH. She was born 17 July 1842 in Smyrna, Chenango County, New York. James and Phebe lived in Pleasant Valley, Jo Daviess County, Illinois. James d 20 September 1863 at the Battle of Chickamauga, Georgia in the Civil War. Phebe remarried 18 July 1870 to Julius BUSS in Jo Daviess County, Illinois. I will be happy to exchange information on any of these lines!

ERICKSON CEMETERY

The Erickson Cemetery is located in Liberty County on the NE% of Sec. 33 T30 N., R 6E. It is 13 miles south of Chester, Montana, on Highway 223, 1 mile west on the Tiber Dam road and % mile south. It is % mile south of the Delmar Wolfe farm, the owner of the NE%. This NE% of Sec. 33 is the original homestead of Abraham Steen, brother of Andrew and Theodore Steen, and it was his wish that part of his land be used for a cemetery. Abraham died of consumption the 9th of June 1915 and a few days later was buried on his homestead and so the start of the cemetery.

The Erickson Cemetery is 200 feet N. to S. and 150 feet E. to W. and is located in the SE corner of the NE% of Sec. 33. This cemetery was researched starting from the SE corner and going by rows.


