

EARLY DAYS PHOTOS DISPLAY



A MARKER FOR OSCAR

The Broken Mountains Genealogical Society has been working on records for the cemeteries in Liberty County. I took the cemetery of my ancestors to do. It's a peaceful little cemetery south of Chester, which is on the homestead of my great uncle, Abraham Steen. There were two old unmarked and supposedly unknown graves. Fortunately, my mother, Josie Wolfe knew whose they were.

One grave was that of a tiny baby, Olive George. After I located her death certificate, the caretaker made a cement marker for the grave. A newspaper microfilm of the 1918 Chester papers confirmed my mothers' story about the grave. The newspaper account stated that the Bill George family was leaving the country in a team and wagon when his wife began to labor. They returned, but the baby lived only a few hours.

The other unmarked grave really intrigued me. Mother said he'd been

a nice quiet fellow that worked for the Gibsons and had died during World War I. Thus began the search for information about Oscar Nelson, so that I could obtain a Veteran's marker from the Veteran's Administration. My mother and Neva Gibson Heimbigner told me he was a wellliked fellow; they thought he came from the midwest and they knew nothing about his family. Mother saidshe'd gone on a couple of dates with him and probably would have gonewith him if my dad hadn't been in the picture. His death certificate revealed his age as 27, death date as 6th December 1918 and that he died of bronchial pneumonia and was buried at the Erickson cemetery 3rd November 1918.

I obtained a short article on his death from the microfilmed old Chester papers that the Liberty County Library has. From this I learned that Oscar Nelson had died aboard ship on his way overseas, just before the vessel had reached France. His remains were escorted home by a Private of the French Army on detached service and he received a military funeral at the Erickson cemetery.

I next contacted the V.A. to obtain a marker for the grave. From their records they sent me the following information: Oscar Nelson had enlisted 22 July 1918, was sent to Fort Dodge, Iowa and then was sent to Leavenworth, Kansas. He was a Pvt. in the Signal Corps., was shipped overseas the 23rd September 1918 and on 6th October 1918 was a victim of broncho-pneumonia following influenza. It listed his Army Serial number and his Compensation Claim number and gave his occupation as farmer. I still don't have a birth date nor birth place for Oscar.

I wonder about the nice, quiet fellow that was buried here and the absence of a family. The V.A. has authorized a marker for his grave and at this writing, we are awaiting it's arrival.

May you rest in peace, Oscar Nelson.

Helferich of Compton, California, in March 1981 asking for information or contact with someone who might know anything concerning the Kirkendahl family that came to the hi-line area in 1910. I, as president, went to the courthouse and found a deed for property in Chester and a homestead record. Also, I located a write-up in the "Chester Democrat" concerning the death of August Kirkendahl 12 December 1918. In addition, I located names of people who knew the Kirkendahl's.

I sent the above information to the Helferich's and then received the letter which follows this article, and a check. The members of the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society decided to purchase the following book with the donation: Index of Revolutionary War Pension Applications by National Genealogical Society. The book will be housed in the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society Library in Chester and listed as a contribution from B.P.Helferichs for making this addition to our library possible.

The following excerpt, both taken from the "Chester Democrat" were sent to the Helferich's.

Item from "Chester Democrat" December 20, 1918:

August Kirkendahl, a resident of the Chester country, died at Great Falls Thursday Dec. 12, where he had went to work. The remains were shipped here Monday and he was buried in the Chester Cemetery.

Dear Mrs. Marshall:

I wish to thank you very much for the data you provided on the Krikendals. My step-daughter is the granddaughter of Gustav and Luissa, and she, as well as I, is very appreciative of the information. Her father is deceased and her mother had no knowledge of the Krikendals, and other relatives could only help a little.

Since you are president of the local Genealogical Society, perhaps you would be interested in the data I have collected?

Gustav Kirkental/Krikendal, b June 27, 1869, probably Estonia, d 1939, perhaps in Chicago where he went after the death of his wife (2).

Gustav is thought to have gone to Canada (Barons, Alberta?) about 1902. His first wife was Julia, who d probably 1905. Children: August, Mary, Julia, Margaret, possibly Pauline.

Gustav's second wife, Luissa/Liisa Reimer, b Oct 7, 1873, Estonia, d May 22, 1916 on the farm at Chester. They married probably 1908 in Canada, moved to Montana 1910. Children: Charley, b 1909?; Bill, b Jan 21, 1911; Lou, b Apr 20, 1912; Ed, b Aug 17, 1913. According to distant relatives, when Luissa died, Gustav was unable to care for children and placed them in an orphanage.

Well, I don't know if the above is of interest to you, but it's about early residents of your area.

Thanks for the adress of Mrs. Ida Kerr and Mrs. Snuffer. I had already contacted Mrs. Snuffer (from address Postmaster sent), and will now also write to Mrs. Kerr. If you should happen to learn where in Estonia Gustav and Luissa came from, I certainly would appreciate the information.

Once again, thanks very much for the information, copies of records, and for your time and effort in obtaining and sending the data. Please accept the enclosed to defray the costs, and as a contribution to your society.



scattering



As members of the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society worked at compiling "Wolf District Cemetery" records they also enjoyed watching the farmers "reap the rewards" of their year's labor.

MORE ABOUT THE UNKNOWNS IN THE UNNAMED CEMETERY SOUTH OF CHESTER --By Helen Ann Aaberg

In an effort to shed more light on the mysteries surrounding the South Chester Cemetery discussed in the September 1981 "Searcher" several members of the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society went to Fort Benton to research records at the court house there. It now appears that the Cemetery was called "The Wolf District Cemetery".

Records at Fort Benton revealed that Mary WOLF (b. 28 January 1916 and d. 6 March 1917) is buried in a place called St. Francis Cemetery. Since this is the only marker visible and readable, it would appear that the little Catholic Church was named St. Francis. The Church rec-

ords read "buried along the Marias".
Others in the same cemetery are listed as buried in "The Wolf Cemetery".
Thus exists the confusion in early day records.

The other definite burial record found in Fort Benton was one of a Sarah Elizabeth POSEY (b. 28 July 1850 d. 6 March 1923), buried in the Wolf Distrist Cemetery. A possibility of a burial in this same cemetery is Gottfried FLATER, (d. 11 October 1922). His address was Russell; place of death occurred in Township 28 of Liberty County, which is in the area, but place of burial was listed as "Hervin or Herwin" Cemetery.

Liberty County Records produced only two burial records for the Wolf Cemetery: that of Mary Frances WILLBORN, (b. 14 February 1859 in Lamont, Mo., d. 18 November, 1920) of gastric ulcers at 61 years of age. Burial was Wolfe Cemetery. Her father's name was Ruben D. HAVEN or DEHAVEN, born in Virginia; her mother was unknown, but was born in Virginia.

The other record was of Analius Frances BIEGONEK, (b. 5 March 1921, d. 14 March 1921) of lobar pneumonia. Father was Mickel, born in Minnesota, mother was Anna Fresel, born in Austria. Residence was Selma. Burial was in Wolf Cemetery.

Neighbors still residing near the little cemetery thought it possible others are buried there but to date no records have been found. Names of persons they gave as possible buried there are: other WILLBORNS, Tony MILLER, a KESSLER baby, a ROMAIN baby, a Pete OLEAN, Joe BAUMGARTNER, a person named STOUT, and an Otto FLATER.

It seems that in those early days residents of that area could not come to Chester unless the river was frozen over. This was true until the Meissner Bridge was built. A trip to Fort Benton was also arduous, especially in winter months and there exists the possibility that not all deaths were registered in a county. Many records were lost in those early homesteading days by the mere fact that travel was extremely difficult, mail delivery erratic, and medical assistance scarce.

If anyone has knowledge concerning the Wolf District Cemetery, the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society would appreciate hearing of it.



PRAIRIE SCHOONER MERCHANT STARTED CHESTER TRADING COMPANY.

CHESTER—Frank Charles Baker, "prairie schooner merchant", dreamed of a quick fortune in the rough and rowdy cowtown of Chester. That dream led to a pioneer business, The Chester Trading Co., still operated by the Baker family.

Baker came to Montana in 1889, settling at Helena with his wife and three children, Walter, Charles and Helen. In 1891 they moved to Great Falls. Baker had worked in general merchandising and in Great Falls he went to work for the Wertheim Clothing Co.

EACH FALL Baker traveled across the prairie toward the Canadian line with a covered wagon loaded with winter clothing. He sold his merchandise to cattle ranchers and sheepmen and their hired hands. Often he spent two days at a ranch outfitting a family. A driver-cook accompanied Baker on the annual trip that lasted from six weeks to two months.

After 15 years of traveling the prairies each fall, Baker was convinced he might amass a fortune in a few years in Chester, which then boasted the Chester Hotel, Grand Hotel-Cafe-Bar, the Prairie Inn, 10 saloons, a general store and a few shacks.

Three years later, in 1909, he and Alex Wright bought the general store from Bourne and Hamilton and began to enlarge the one-room building which had a small post office annex.

BY 1910 the store employed 20 people and was serving as a bank for the area as well as the post office. The store's merchandise included groceries, clothing, piece goods, furniture, rugs, stoves,

hardware, buggies, wagons, machinery and lumber. Its slogan became "We Sell Everything." It's still on the front of the Chester Trading Co.

Alex Wright lived in a small house behind the store; Frank Baker lived above the store. Mrs. Wright and Mrs. Baker refused to live in the dusty little cowtown. The Baker family visited in Chester each summer but returned to Great Falls in the fall.

HOMESTEADERS poured into the area in 1910; more businesses were formed. By 1914, Baker still had not acquired the fortune he had expected to make. Faced with a serious drought and heavy credit to homesteaders, the Chester Trading Co. was advised by its auditor to discontinue credit or go broke—but Baker and Wright disregarded that advice and didn't go broke.

Wright and Baker served alternately as postmaster. One oldtimer recalls that Wright refused to give change in pennies if a nickel was offered for a two-cent stamp. The customer took two two-cent stamps and a one-center.

The partners were of different political beliefs--Wright was a Democrat and Baker a Republican. Their arguments often were heated, but they always interrupted them to take care of business. Frank Baker served as senator from Liberty County for a time.

THE STORE was on 3 1/2 acres of land enclosed by a high fence. Stockmen often used this area to hold their cattle or sheep overnight when they were brought in for shipment.

Later the store added a drug department, lines of farm machinery, gasoline pumps, grease and oils.

BAKER'S DAUGHTER, Helen, a graduate of Great Falls High School, worked in the Great Falls public library there for seven years, then moved to California with her mother. In 1928 she came to Chester to visit

her father for six weeks but decided to remain here and has worked at the store ever since.

Her brother, Charles, who is associated with her in the business now, holds a degree in architecture from the University of Michigan. He worked with George Shanley, Great Falls architect, until 1930 when he joined his father and sister in business. Walter Baker also joined the store that year but in 1940 moved to Oregon.

Mrs. Baker moved to Chester in 1930 and lived there until her death in 1937. Frank Baker died in 1935 and his partner, Alex Wright in 1932.

IN 1940 the Chester Trading Co. discontinued its general merchandise bus-

ness, concentrating on meats, groceries and sundries. Charles Baker manages the over-the-counter meat department; Helen Baker is grocery manager. They have one full-time employe, Art Kaiser, and some part-time help.

The Bakers have done much to change the store from counter-buying to self service, but the changeover has not been total and much of the atmosphere of the old Chester Trading Co. is retained.

HELEN BAKER

Helen was born in Helena, Mt., 31 January 1892. She died at the age of 80 years on 22 June 1972 in Chester. Funeral services were held 26 June 1972 at eleven at Croxford & Sons Mortuary in Great Falls. Burial was in Great Falls, Highland Cemetery. She was a member of the Assembly of God Church. Survivors were brother, Charles, of Chester and nephew, Franklin, of Corvallis, Oregon.




CHARLES BAKER

CHESTER TRADING COMPANY CLOSED--After 71 years in business Chester Trading Company has been closed, probably never again to reopen. Franklin Baker told a Times reporter last week the building will set vacant this winter, and next spring or summer he plans to have it torn down. Actually the business is older that 71 years. was in 1909 that Frank Baker and Alex Wright bought the general store from Borne-Hamilton and renamed it Chester Trading Company. The business grew until it was the largest business between Shelby and Havre for many years. "We sell everything" was the motto. Chester Trading Co. (*Bourne-Hamilton)

sold groceries, dry goods, drugs, hardware, farm machinery, gasoline, oils, and anything else you can imagine. When World War II broke out it became so difficult to hire help that the firm put on a quitting business sale, and practically everything but the grocery line was discontinued. Since then the business has been but a shadow of its once greatness.

STOCK OWNERS ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE


MARIAS CROSSING, 16 January 1885 Editors of River Press: SIR--In as much as your journal is a leading source of information to stockmen of this section, we will beg leave to mention a few facts concerning the condition of stock in this region.

The recent storms have caused cattle to drift in large quantities—seeking protection from the inclement weather, in the coolies and brush in this vicinity. There has been such an

immense drift of them, that they have eaten the grass, in the bottoms, down as smooth as a floor, and are now ravaging the barnyards and haystacks; thereby causing a great deal of annoyance to settlers. We will also mention that they are crossing the Marias and Missouri rivers in crowding multitudes, and it will be well for stockmen who feel interested to employ sufficient help to return them to their respective ranges—thereby saving a heavy expense in rounding up.

Stockmen sitting around their fires, at home, do not seem to realize the conditions their stock is in in this section of the country.

23 January 1885

The death of Major E.M Baker, of the Second cavalry is announced. He distinguished himself as an Indian fighter and commanded in the fight with the Piegans, which took place a few miles east of where Billings now stands, and what is known as Baker's battleground.

Editor's note: Baker's battleground is on the Marias, northwest of this city fifty or sixty miles, and nearly 300 miles from where "Billings now stands".

25 February 1885

M.J. Keith and A.B. Nixon left town this morning on the Billings coach. Mr. Keith is bound for Maiden and Mr. Nixon, one of Benton's popular violinists, bound for Chicago.

22 April 1885

Mrs. Mell. J. Keith left for Maiden by the Billings coach this morning to join her husband.

20 May 1885

An old timer well acquainted with the country says, the nearest route to the Sweet Grass hills, is to go to the ranch of the Benton & St. Louis cattle company over a very good road—the ranch is half way—and then straight across the prairie to the middle Butte. He says there are no obstructions and the journey can be made easily in two days.

J.J. Hill and A. Manvel, of the Manitoba road, accompanied the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy officials, who were at St. Paul Tuesday, on their trip to Winnipeg. They went out yesterday morning in a special train.

The Sweet Grass hills are attracting more attention here than was expected. Many people with whom we have conversed have said that they always believed that gold existed there, and the finding of the precious metal creates no astonishment. Several parties will start in a few days to look the ground over and see for themselves what the chances of success will be. As the hills are only two days drive from Benton no difficulty will be experienced in reaching them.

THE SWEET GRASS HILLS

M.B. Carey, one of the original discoverers of gold in the Sweet Grass Hills, and the one who first brought the news to Benton, arrived in the city last evening. He is enthusiastic over the outlook. There are now thirty or thirty five men in the camp, who will remain all winter and continue the work of drifting and making preparations for for a big clean-up in the spring. The water is now freezing up, but a little money is still being taken out. On the whole the miners are well satisfied with the summer's work, and predict big things for next season. Messrs. Peck and Graham have discovered a vein of good coal convenient to the camp. Mr. Carey will return to the mines in a few days.

Let me dream that love goes with us to the shore unknown.
