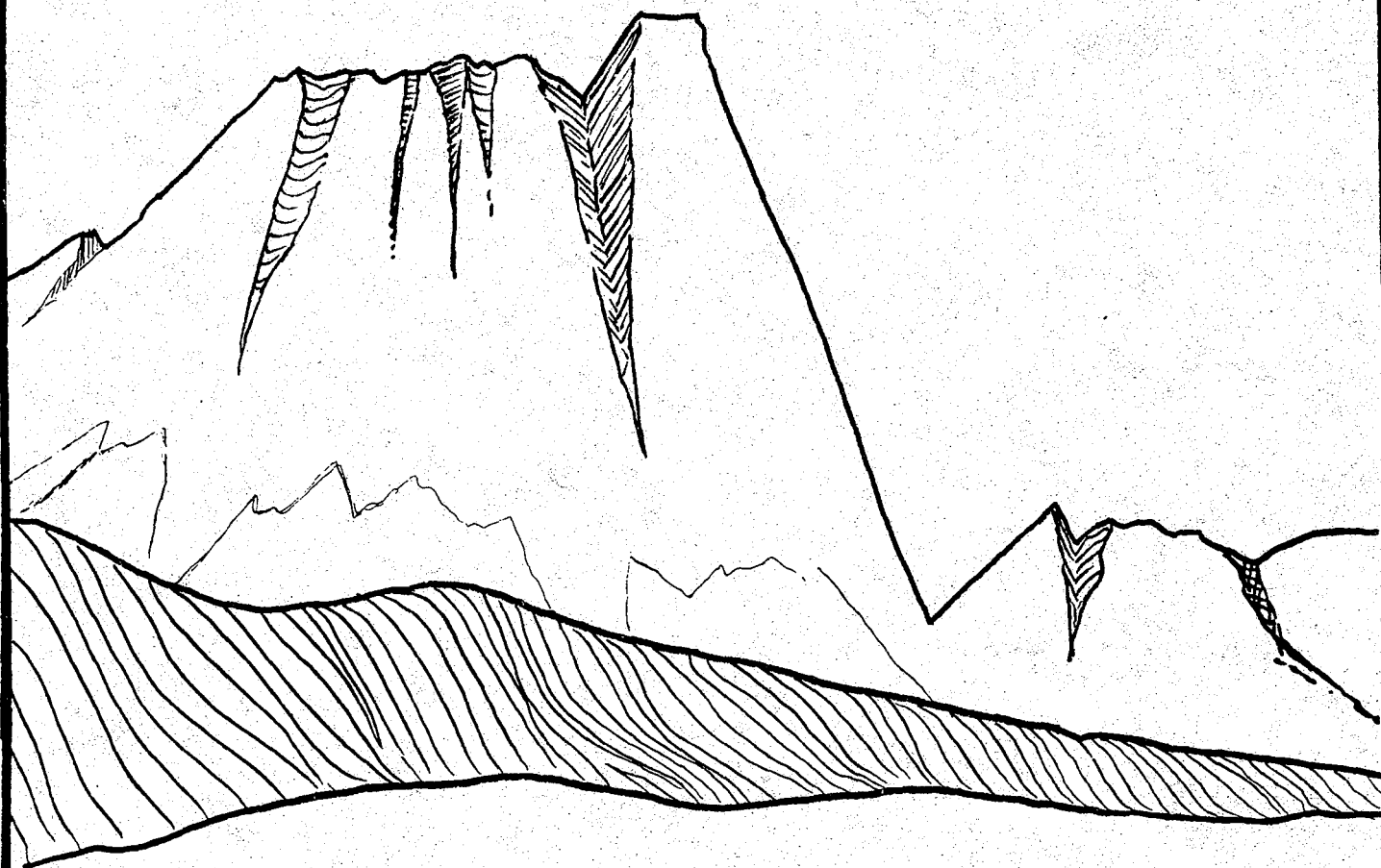

## THE SEARCHER BECOMES THE TRI-COUNTY SEARCHER

Because there are so many genealogical periodicals named The Searcher and we had been asked to consider re-naming our publication, we chose The Tri-County Searcher for several reasons. When we formed our society we decided it would encompass all of Liberty County, part of Hill County and part of Toole County making the Tri-County Searcher a most appropriate name. Another reason for that selection was that Liberty County has been part of Hill County at one time and also part of Choteau County thus our searching for records is indeed a tri-county search.

Hill-County was named after James Hill, the railroad man who touted the glories of the west and induced many a homesteader to pack his bags and come to the land he so glowingly described. Hill County was formed in 1912 having been part of Chouteau County to that time. In 1920 parts of Hill County were taken to form Liberty County. Chester is the county seat of Liberty County and was a rest stop back in the 1880s for ranchers on their way to the railhead at Minot, N.D. before the railroad went through the Hi-Line. Legend has it that one of the buildings on the Chester Trading Co. property was the rest stop not only for ranchers but for the stage coaches traveling from Fort Benton north to Gold Butte. Mrs. Langel is currently reading the microfilm of Fort Benton newspapers of 1890 and has established that that is when the railroad came through the hi-line. Chester was mentioned frequently in that time span. So little is known of the very first days of the little community but the name supposedly came from a railroad telegrapher. The librarian had an inquiry from a family named Chester who had been told it was named after an ancestor. Others say the telegrapher named it after his hometown in Pennsylvania. Perhaps the real origin is yet to be found in the earlier newspapers as yet unread.

The Chester Signal published January 16, 1913, was already campaigning for formation of a new county suggesting it be called Marias County. "Now is the time we should be starting a campaign for the creation of the county we all wish to see on the Montana map. There is no time like the present to get things under way. There is nothing to be lost by getting busy and there are so many little things in favor of an early campaign that we suggest our west end people get busy and organize a committee to look up records and when we have the required assessment get extra busy and complete the deal. It is without question the only way the west end will ever come into its own. The greediness of the Havre politicians has been displayed so many times that as long as we remain a part of Hill County, just so long will we be under the protecting (?) wing of the "ring." "

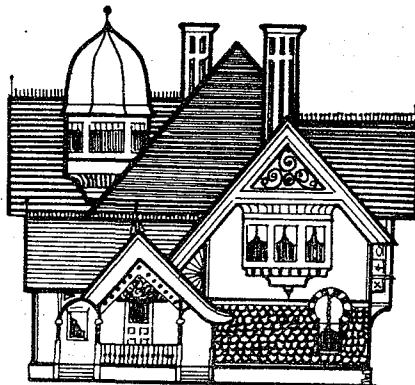
BOOKLET ON HISTORY OF OLD BUILDINGS TO BE PUBLISHED

The Broken Mountain Genealogical Society in cooperation with local historian Ruby Langel, the Liberty Village Arts Center and Gallery and possibly the Liberty County Museum will research and publish a booklet on the history of the old buildings of the area. So much genealogy is contained in those histories that we feel it important to gather and publish our findings.

Many of the businesses in and around Chester are housed in very old buildings that have been remodeled and maintained to a full life of usefulness. Some of them were built where they now stand while others were moved to town from smaller towns such as Lothair, fifteen miles west. Lothair was once a thriving, bustling town larger than Chester and now there are no businesses and only a handful of homes. The old gold mining town of Gold Butte in the Sweetgrass Hills is not even a ghost town -- all its buildings having vanished or moved to other locations. The little village of Tiber once had a post office and a few homes and businesses where now only grain elevators mark it as a location.

Mrs. Langel has spent countless hours at the local library reading the old Chester, Joplin and Fort Benton papers for information on the buildings of the area. Without her initial effort I'm sure the undertaking of a booklet would look impossible. What started out for her as a project for her employer, the Chester Implement Co., became one far broader than she intended. She became engrossed in items pertaining to her own family history and then began looking for items of interest to others who heard of her research. One thing led to another until Ruby found herself deeply involved in the history of the entire town.

The role of the Art Center in the booklet will be pen and ink sketches of some of the buildings and photography of others. The Museum will no doubt assist with historical data, photographs, etc. and the Genealogical Society will perhaps do oral histories relating to the buildings plus interviews of those who remember the old days. We would ask that anyone reading this article and knowing of information or photographs of the older establishments contact us. At this time we do not know how many buildings will be researched or if it will include homes. Many of the early homesteaders built the typical "homestead shack" and there were not really that many well built or beautiful homes. Those that are outstanding or were considered interesting for one reason or another will no doubt find a place in the booklet.



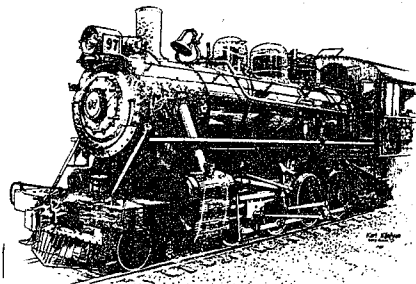
A 1918 newspaper printed in Havre describes Jonlin (10 miles east of Chester) as being on the main line of the Great Northern Railway, with a population estimated to be over 300 and rapidly assuming city proportions. "This is evidenced by the fact that in 1910 it was designated on the Great Northern map by a section house, and today its long lines of cement sidewalks and boulevards extending through its business district and well out into the residence portion, mark its progress."

"It has a beautiful city park, an excellent \$10,000 up-to-date public school, three fine churches, first class hotels, a number of large general stores, and every other line of business required in the making of a first class town. Another evidence of the prosperity of this town is the long lines of heavily loaded wagons waiting their turn to unload their grains of every known variety of the large elevators of the town."

The same newspaper described Lothair (15 miles west of Chester) as being on the main line of the Great Northern Railway and in the west end of the county. It is a new town of about 50 inhabitants, has a bank, a good school house, a church, 3 general stores, 2 lumber yards, 2 elevators and a live weekly newspaper, the Lothair Ledger. Today Lothair has no business establishments and about seven homes.

Whitlash, a little community near the Canadian border is the other town in Liberty County. According to stories told regarding the naming of Whitlash, the name was intended to be Whiplash but the writer or the reader of the information made an error and it came out Whitlash. Once a thriving community with a large general store and several other business establishments, Whitlash now has only a post office and no other businesses to keep it alive. Of great importance to the early day ranchers in the Sweetgrass Hills, the town of Whitlash provided a great deal of the necessities and now the memories of days gone by. A more complete history of the town and its buildings will forthcoming in the planned booklet.

We hope that in printing names of towns and the buildings that were once a part of each town it will assist someone in their search for genealogical information. If these buildings could talk and reveal their own history, what a history that would be!



Typical of some of the buildings of Chester is the former bank building now housing the Darby O'Brien Agency. The basement for this brick structure was dug in March of 1910. An article in the local newspaper dated 9/15/1910 states "The new brick building for the First State Bank of Chester is rapidly taking shape." A headline dated 12/8/1910 states "The cash, the officers and everything portable of the First State Bank was moved from the little building into the new handsome brick building on the corner of Front and First Street." The bank eventually was closed and has since been used for various purposes including a hospital, a rooming house and finally the insurance business. The old picture shown below was found in the effects of C. E. Biggs, one of Chester's more enterprising businessmen of early days. The little building which was the first bank can be seen immediately to the right of the brick building in the process of being built.

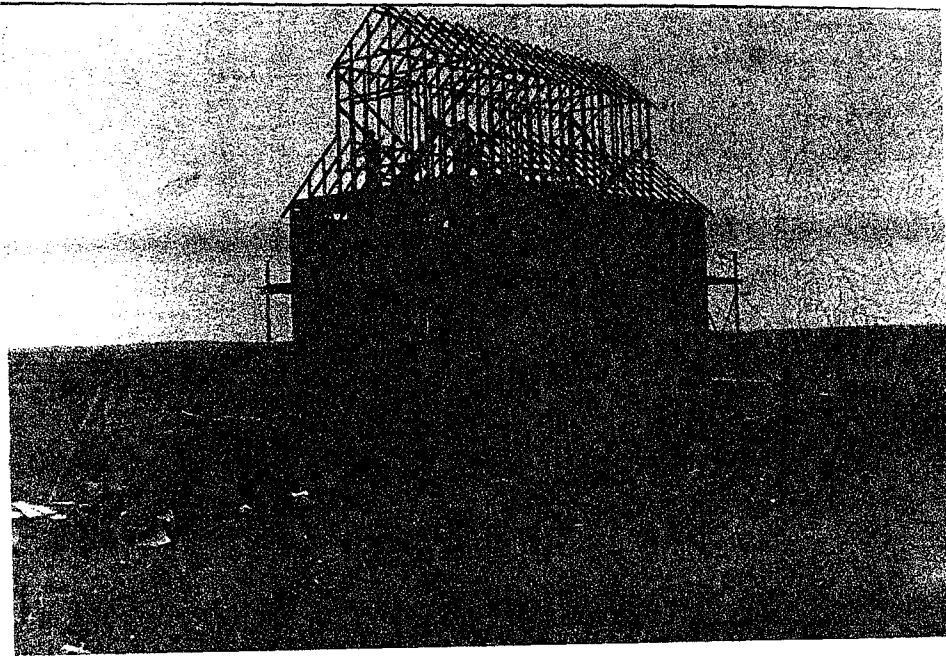
CORRECTION

One of the interesting buildings of early Chester was the flour mill. C. E. Biggs announced plans to build a flour mill in December of 1914 with construction to begin immediately. In December 1915 the newspaper carried an article on the mill's opening saying it was "tried" a few days ago and is now running in full operation. The mill too felt the depression years and closed its doors later becoming home for the Otto Whelchel family. When the family scattered and the building had no occupants a decision was made to raze it and an empty spot on Third Street East is mute testimony to what once was a thriving business. The picture also was found in the C. E. Biggs treasure of early day memorabilia.

GLEANINGS FROM EARLY NEWSPAPERS

The Chester Signal - June 23, 1910  
A Most Important Question For Chester  
People To Solve

The question of having a cemetery has suddenly become one of much importance. This sheet has preached and preached that we get together and select a place where we can lay our loved ones when their earthly work has ended, but evidently every one thought there would be no danger of them dying and so the matter has dragged along. We urged this matter two years ago when it would have been an easy matter to have selected a site and had everything fixed up. True, there was an attempt made, when the present site was selected, but with the coming of the new people the land that contained the new burying place was filed upon and is now a part of a man's homestead claim.

Very fortunately we have not had any deaths among us for some time, and as long as we did not have to find a place to dig a grave, it has been neglected. Now we find we have a city and the matter of deaths will certainly not keep down. We must find a place to lay them.

We believe that the best thing to do would be for us to call a public meeting, and then select a committee to look into the matter and also to see if the man that filed on the present burying grounds would not be willing to relinquish the forty that the graves are on and then we would get the government to deed it to a cemetery association. The site is a good one and it would be much less expense to buy than to have to find another place and move the bodies of those that are now resting there. Let there be something done at once.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM CHURCH RECORDS

In the early pioneer days Our Lady of Ransom Catholic Church, Hingham, Montana, was 'home parish', with churches in at least Chester, Inverness, Goldstone, Black Coulee and Cottonwood serving as missions.

Eventually, Cottonwood was included in a different parish; Black Coulee disbanded because homesteaders were moving away. The faithful worshipped at nearby missions.

In 1949, Chester formed their own parish, St. Mary's.

Currently, Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Inverness, Montana, a mission and Our Lady of Ransom, the parent church, are the only two Catholic Churches remaining in the parish.

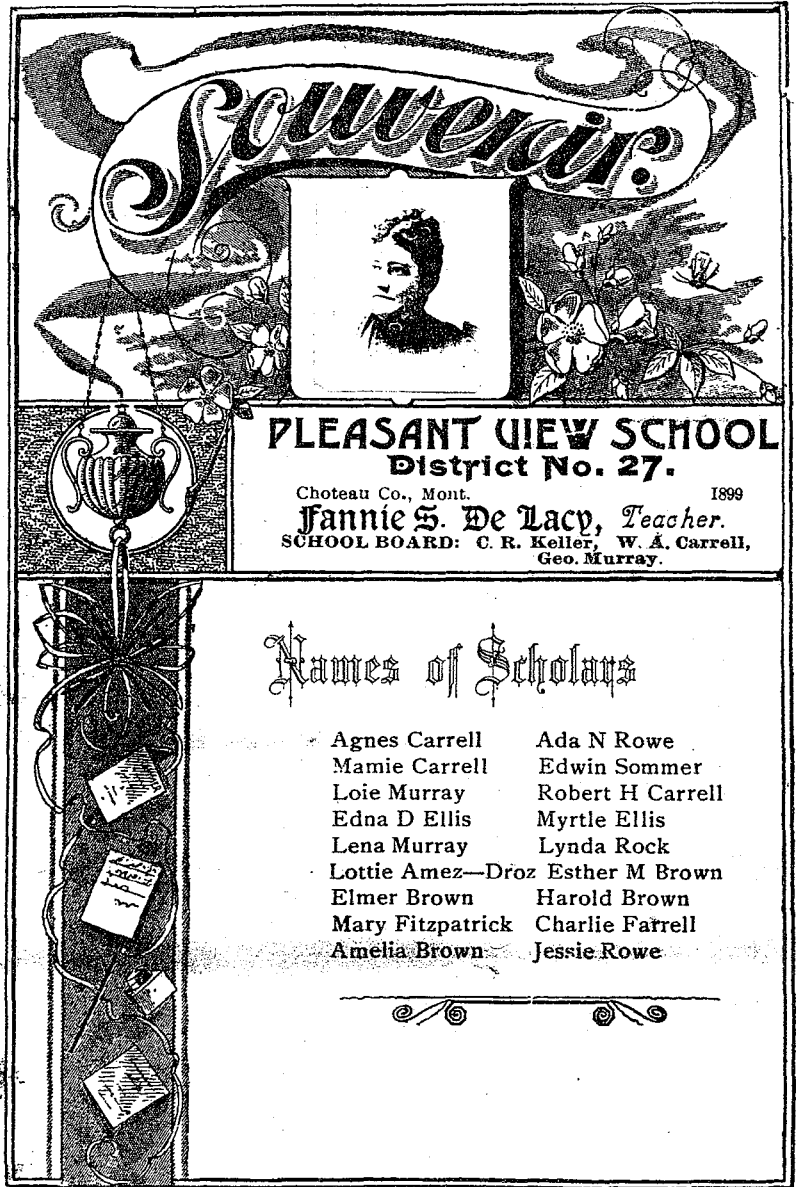

Above is a souvenir card which was presented by a teacher to her students in Whitlash Montana in 1899. Mrs. Glenn Aiken (Evelyn Allen) of Whitlash loaned the card for our use. Several names of the scholars have descendents still in the area -- the familiar names are Murray, Brown and Amesz-Droz. The Jessie Rowe whose name appears on the card is the girl who died so young and whose lonely grave was robbed of its tombstone (story in an earlier publication of The Searcher).

Lottie Amesz-Droz is an ancestor of Janell Roke Wardell; Amelia Brown was married to William Demarest and her son and family still reside in the area; The Brown family still ranches in the area and the Murray name is connected with Glenn Aiken.
