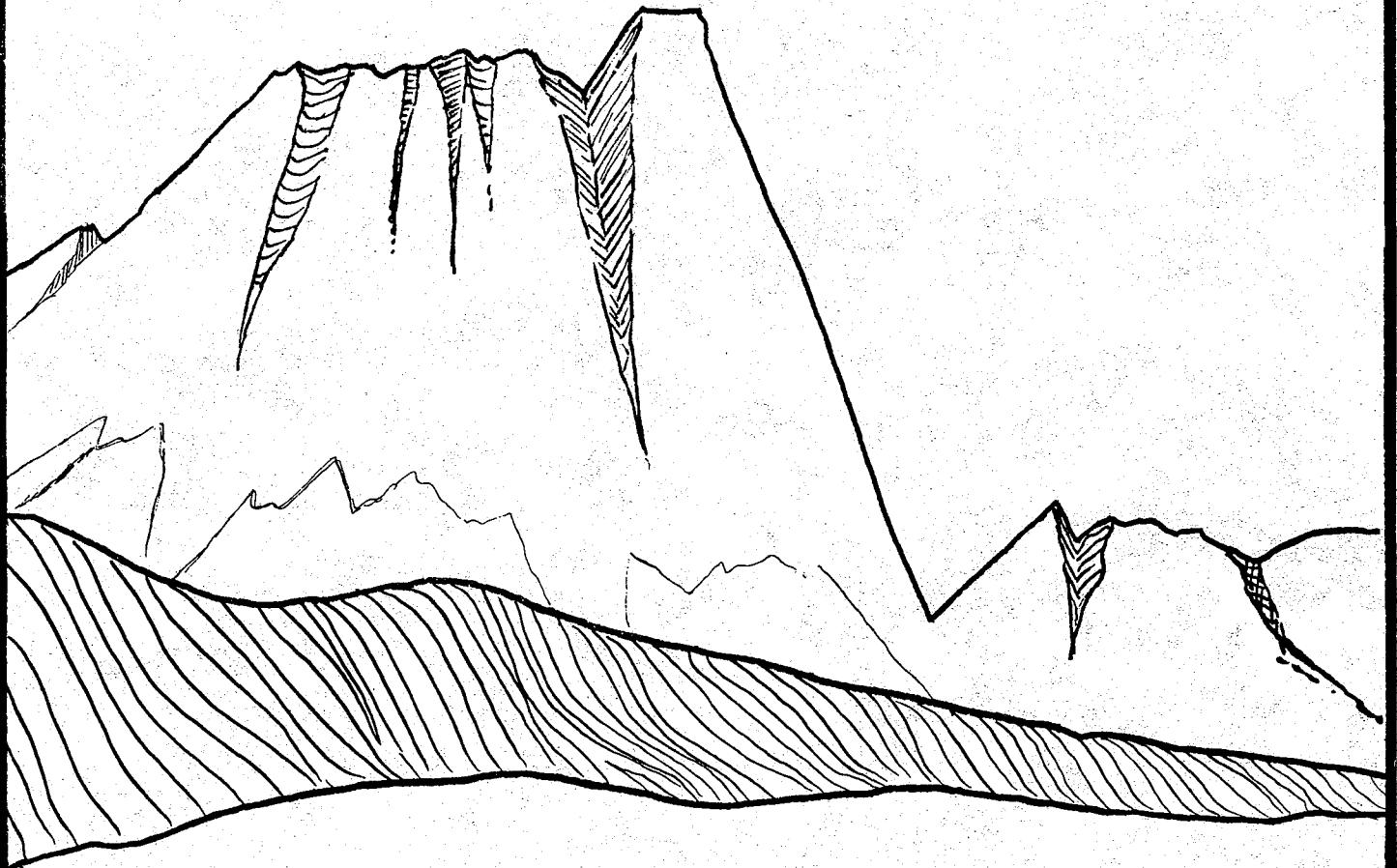

The family of William Robert Marshall and his wife Sadie Taplin plan a family reunion this summer.

William Robert Marshall was born in Ospery Twp. Grey Co., Ont. Canada Sept. 30, 1883. His father was W. Henry Marshall and mother Sarah Grey or Gray. William left home at a early age and as far as we know he had no contact with his parents or family. William married Sadie Taplin the 4 Dec. 1916. William passed away the 15th of May 1954 in Havre, Montana U.S.A.

William's father W. Henry Marshall was born in 1856 probably Ospery Twp. Grey Co. Ont. He died on Sept. 12, 1916 in Owen Sound, Ont. Canada. He was in the grocery business at 1131 Third Avenue East, Owen Sound, Ont. Canada.

There was a sister Maude who was married to Charles H. Lewis and in 1916 lived at 1145 Third Avenue East, Owen Sound, Ont. Canada.

KATHERINE TAPLIN'S LETTERS TO A FRIEND

The following letters are written by Katherine Taplin to a friend Mrs. Clarence Taylor in Kingsley, Iowa. Mrs Taylor's daughter Alice found these letters and in writing her about the Taplin family she sent them. The Taylor's came to Kingsley, Iowa in 1891, he set out lots of fruit, apple orchard and one acre of grapes and ect. So they sold fruit at the farm. Alice, Mrs. Taylor's daughter remembered Katie and some of the family coming by team and buggy for fruit. The Taylors lived 1 mile East and 2½ miles south of Kingsley , Iowa and the Taplins lived on the West edge of Kingsley.

Maybe before I go any further I should give a little history about the people here.

Solomon Taplin was born to John Taplin and Dorothy Cale in Banbury, Oxford shire England the 25 Nov. 1861. He came to the United States when he was 22 years old. Most of his brothers and sisters came too. He married Katherine Morwood who was born March 10, 1869 possibly Belfast, Ireland, they were married 31 August 1889 in Kingsley, Iowa. Her parents name were Samuel Morwood and Sarah McKelvey.

Solomon and Katherine Taplin had 10 children and they were all born in Kingsley, Iowa. Their names are as follows: Roy, Bertha, Effie, Sadie, Clara, Agnes, Annie, Amelia, Ralph and Katherine.

The Taplins left Kingsley in Oct. 1911. Sadie my husbands mother was born in 1894 so she would have been 17 years old.

West of Kingsley there is a creek called Westford Creek or sometimes a river. on this creek or river was a dam and flour mill. When the river got high, fish (Carp) would be in the shallow places and couldn't get out. Mr. Taplin would take a gun and shoot some large ones. Clifford, Alice's brother said that Mr. Taplin would give their grandfather some fish. Mr. Solomon Taplin had a butcher shop and in May 1906 William

Schneideskamp of Decatur, Nebraska purchased Solomon Taplins butcher shop. Then Jan 1907 Solomom Taplin and Son went into the country to butcher at any farm desiring their services. These two news idems were out of the Kingsley news paper.

The Taplins and Taylors were not to well acquainted. But Clarence Taylor was always interested in people who moved to new parts of our country. And he asked them to write. Katie was so glad to hear from Mrs. Taylor.

In one of the letters Katherine mentions some thing about her two darlings buried in Iowa. A person named Otto Roepke said that the Taplins bought lots in the cemetery. This Otto checked and there are several stones out there with names and dates on them but they aren't legible anymore. But there were no names or dates in the records. The name of the cemetery is Old Elkhorn Cemetery.

My Dear Friend Mrs. Taylor

As Annie is writing I will add a few lines Was much surprised to hear they news about your new boy hope you and him are well also hope all they family are well We are pretty well And have escaped they Flue as so far We have not been going any where OH we was to Effie Thanksgiving for dinner Agnes Ben Came to go Sadie Bill are at Great Falls Where Bertha lives Bill working there We had a letter from Clara and babe picture I could not believe my eyes to see how he had growed As he was such a tinny little thing I been knitting stockings for him And they were to small So She sent me they picture of one she took of his knew measures 9 inches Oh Mrs Taylor it is shure lonesome now No one to come home on Sundays But Agnes Ben they cannot make they trip on these short days Effie used to drive but to cold now had a card from Roy he was well oh how I wish I could see

him coming It breaks my heart to think I could not send him a little tobacco for Christmas he never sent for anything Bertha told me if he sent a slip to send it to her But he did not My I bet Roy misses they Kingsley we have not had it now for 5 weeks We all miss it so much I never read they storry just they news I hope none of you will get they flue hope your plumes wont spoil My friut wont I have seen no fruit not even an apple pit So it is they first time we have been like this I hope to you it is they last time It is they first year we have had no vegatable And I been diging our crop of potatoes I got them all dug it is any good got about 5 bushells for 2½ days diging I hurried out as soon as I done the work up Papa has not been home they last 3 days for dinner so I eat a bit So I could get all done I could very few as large as a good egg lots and lots of them the size of a hazel nut I will save them for seed I we live to need them I shure get discouraged they way we both worked and nothing to show for it Now we needed flour So We have sold all our hens of but 30 and a few young ones that will be more than we will get feed for I am Afariad And we will have the slimest lot of meat we ever had our pigs get nothing to eat but they oats that is coming up since we got the rain in August I could throw either one over the fence very easy he thinks he will have to sell some of them Some of us need under wear and shoes overshoes that will shure take money It seems they smaller they family they worse of we are only they 4 children to home Oh If my boy was only nearer how he is in France just got a letter from him Sat He was not seasick And he said he was not a tale stuck on the place they solders tell him it will not last much longer I tell you tomorrow would suit me Oh how glad I would be If I could see Roy coming on his old trail from his claim how I am afariad Clara husband may have to go I shure miss them and her dear tot now next is to worry is Agnes Sadie man may have to go they both had to regester Mrs Taylor All they family were here 2 Sundays but Roy and Clara Delmar Kenneth I broke down When ROY was not here Oh

his last words still rings in my ears First time he called me Mother it was Always Mama he said Mother It cannot be helped When his horses come up I cannot keep the tears back he thought so much of them We have 3 here Papa works them He had to stop plowing it was so hard and dry Well I am so glad you folks done so well on your Mont farm I wish we had a few tons of the hay All in the neighbourhood filled out Blanks for aid but we have not heard if we was going to get any We never needed it so bad Bertha was up on a visit 2 weeks with us 1 with Agnes Clara Delmar sent us a barrell of vegetables 1 dozen cabage Beats Carrets Parsnips onions and 2 kinds of Beans he wrote his folks before he left here to save all their garden truck that they didnot need So he could send us some They got a hail storm but did not hurt their garden so very much I tell you it is a big treat Delmar working with a thrashing crew Clara stays at his folks to see if he has to be called Papa went to Agnes place yestarday Sadie Bill are up their Bill cut some polls for fence poasts So he sent word for Papa to come and get some to fence Roys crop We have to see to his business We could not get them on time Banks wont loan any money either So it is bad all around that will be a job to put the fence in for Papa andI We wanted to fence some on ours I am glad to hear you got so many Plumes and pickles I have not eatin cuecumbers for years till one day I was in town Papa was hungry for a pickle he got a dime worth to eat with our lunch And I could a eat the hole lot We have had no sour stuf all summer we allways had lots of letuce to eat not a blade this time hope you have all apples you need I have not seen an apple this year We only get 1 or 2 eggs make butter to do from 1 gallon milk I dont eat butter yet hope you will get a big price for your hogs Well I must close and hoping to find you all well Remember me to your Mother and Best Regards to one and all Your ever old Friend Katie

My Dear Friend

Mrs. Taylor and Family

I have put off writing to you for so long And you been on my mind many a time So I feel tired and I am gong to write It may not be very interesting but you will know how we are We all have had colds sore throats I was in bed with it 2 days I had such a headacke Papa throat was bad for over a month Roy got a bad cold now just like he had when he was in the trenches he not puting in much crop going to summer fallow Well I been around our 100 acares of wheat scattering golfer dop the wheat is up and looks green but I see a few places that the cut worms are working Some are complaining that they are taking their grain Well we are feeling the blues pretty bad 5 weeks ago we filled out a Blank for the aid for the Drouth pepole and we have not got returns and we have not got our oats in Waiting for the money And we have been having such nice rains the last 2 weeks It sure makes us feel discouraged to think our oats are not in They will come in when the wheat does So Papa been plowing got about 30 acares done since he seeded the wheat Roy helped seed the wheat 3 half days I been on the go all spring doing what I can to help Papa the 3 go to school Agnes was home for over a month So we helped Annie in the house and sewed between times making over old dresses for Katherine some of Melias she had 3 years Bertha sent us 20 yards of Apron Gingham she made it up Made over two shirts for Ralph they are light ones We fixed over some of her dresses for Melia for school Agnes got her a knew outfit Ben got her a nice black silk dress they quit working at the ranch wanted her to go to the upper place 2 women to many Ben ;said So he went to Glacier Park got work So he sent for her a week ago the day she left she got us 25 dollars of groceries we was out of everything We got their cow calf she a good butter cow Sadie and her husband went on a farm the Spring 14 miles north of us Bertha man

been out of work since Feb Clara still in Minn he expects to come here on his homestead next spring Well we have only one spring pig 60 little chicks no fresh cows of our own as yet We have a few potatoes in small ones I saved a little garden in Mrs. Albert sent us some seed Clara sent some I needed quite a bit more Oh it is something feirce to be like this It almost breaks my heart I try to keep up as Solomon feels so bad to work as hard as we do have to be mercy of friends helping us they have all done what they could for us Annie Melia feel so bad they need hats As I have never got them a hat Annie was 17 So not many can say that she shure as earned as she goes ahead with everything Now I will have a lot of hoeing to do these thistles are shure a pest make so much work I hope you will have a good crop how is it where your farm is in Mont the grass is getting fair now I hope you are well and all the family Oh Mrs Taylor I long to see you all I have many a heartache when I am out working I cannot stand work any more I had a bad spell in the spring with my back for 2 weeks you can guess the trouble Glad it is over I shure did suffer If we have many more years like we have had it will wear both of us out Their are many us the same boat we are in The grain looks nice if the worms dont take it Our gron is all summer fallow Well Decoration will soon be here And my 2 darlings laying their no one to drope a flower on their graves I hope they are happy anyhow Effie got 6 little ones her Mother and Law came a week ago from Wash they are coming over Sunday half of our pie Plant is killed out also our horseraddish Well I have written more than I should So I must stop and get to my chores I put the feed in for the horses have the water pumped for the horses 6 head he uses and 3 disk plow Well so long and write when you can I as ever your Friend Katie and family

Possibly written Jul, Aug 1922

Dear Friend Mrs. Taylor and family

Katherine has wrote to one of the girls so I thought I would scratch a letter to you hope you and all are well We are fairely well Solomon did have a spell last week with sick headache he been having a pain in his side of and on he got his summer follow done so he helped me in the garden lately we got a pretty good garden except cabbage Parsny tomatoes they are neary a failure Spring was so late did not start seeding to May But Praise the Lord we have a fine looking crop 130 acures of wheat 20 of oats 10 seeded late to cut for hay Some of the wheat is passed Papa waist Roy came through Bertha 20 yestarday it is to his 2 Botton on his vest But it is getting so big that we need a good shower We have had lots of moisture had a big rain 2 weeks ago all night one day thirth day a little had our first mess of potatoes today 3 mess of peas have all the raddishs lettuce we can eat got quite a patch of string beans I want to can more than I did last year if we just had a little friut to mix in once in a while I cannot eat Butter yet Bertha remembered me with a box of cherries I canned 9 quarts she said they were just to eat We shure did eat to She is in Oregon lots of Prunes Peaches She said Oh Mamma if I only had your cans I could shure fill them I expect Katherine told about Annies babe I never wanted to

see any of the girls go through It but she put off going to town So she got sick sooner than she expected in the night he came after me so I went he went and got another neighbour then the Doc but she w as not over it till 6 next eve.

They other girls was well Melia been with Annie she can bath a baby as well as a old ladie She used to bath Sadie last summer Agnes Bertha have no family Clara just the one boy Well Mrs Taylor we shure got the blues they State is foreclosing on those that got the loans not been able to pay interest so ours is to be Auctioned off tomorrow got a year to redeem it They expenses will be a lot It is hard the way we have labored on it then to

loose it got a good well buildings are not much but we got along very well by banking up in the winter I had bad luck hatching chicks Ben Agnes sent us 2 Rusters they fought so was the Cause Effie had the best luck she ever had We have had all kinds of grass horses cattle have shure got fat our horses have not had a grain since they got the seeding done and they look good they were shure poor to begin work with South of Chester they had it dry some crops are burned up in our neighbourhood it all looks good that been put in right some do poor work They gofers are bad on the feilds also rabbits we feed them alot still they have took a lot of grain So many Idle homesteads they flock in from them one cannot keep them away I am shure glad to hear you have lots of friut Brother Esaw has all kinds in S. Dak. he writes and wishes we was near so we could have some He lost his wife last fall he cannot give her up he feels as he has nothing to live for Just 2 boys his girls are married one came and took care of Strawberries Cherries he has all kinds Plumes Grapes We never had a great amount but we shure miss it I expect you will soon be loosing some of your family I think they go for themselves to young talking dont do any good We tried our best with ours. Well I better stop it is quite windy today threatnering rain I am baking bread and writing between times so will ring off Best regards to all Your old Friend

May 25, 1925

Dear Friends

Mr. and Mrs Taylor and family

I must write and Thank yous for remembering us And hope the girls will have good success Well we are all pretty well but Solomon he not been well all spring he had a spell with his side for a week could not do anything he has had a cold all spring such a cough and he gets so hors he cannot talk out loud But he been helping all he could get the crop in finished seeding last Thursday that make 180 acares of wheat Some of it is up and looks quite good quite a change for Montana we never had as much moisture as we got now we been diging poust holes and they been wet we had a late snow it shure made moisture then we had a 3 day rain It shure made moisture our Resivour was the fullest it been for several years it was a very late Spring nothing doing till in April lots of grain to seed yet Well the girls were well last we heard from them Ben Agnes was home 13 Came Sat went back Sunday 90 mile trip They expect to come for Dec We fetched strawberries Bertha pretty proud over her Boy he gaining now fast Melia been out working several weeks this spring She was home a few weeks when a man came after her they had a baby Katherine cook as I been helping all I could It takes so much time and work to get the ground ready to work with this pest of Russian thistles I follow the harrow rake and fire them I do what I can before I go We milk 4 cows sell cream I got my crop of chicks I set 8 hens 18 eggs each hatched out 90 chicks no pigs till June or July this time I got the garden in but I never got any squash I forgot to get seed I had lovely vines last year we had a frost in August fixed them proper did not hurt the Citeren vines close to them We had to buy spuds to eat this year just saved seed I hope your family are all well And also hope youget good crops and lots of fruit I see we will have a few gooseberries this year If nothing happens them Well Mrs Taylor a good many changes since we parted our loss is as great as ever I cannot forget him he was such a Dear Roy taken with out

any warning when the nurse saw the end was coming she asked him about his folks he said to her we was over head and ears at work that was about his last only I am going slowly slowly have no enimies then he was gone Ralph is taller than he was pretty good boy goes ahead with the work he done most of the seeding as one drill did not work good Papa he harrowed disked as the stubled in a good deal Ralph uses 6 head of horses Papa 4 Roys horses were Brokos they feel pretty good we still have Maud she cernes in the same as she did years ago Papa has not worked her so much she tires him out to hold her back lots of grass now But their is a Band of sheep close to us Well I wish we could meet again I think our tongues would rattle Well it is getting dark for me to see Tomorrow mail day hope to hear good news from you all

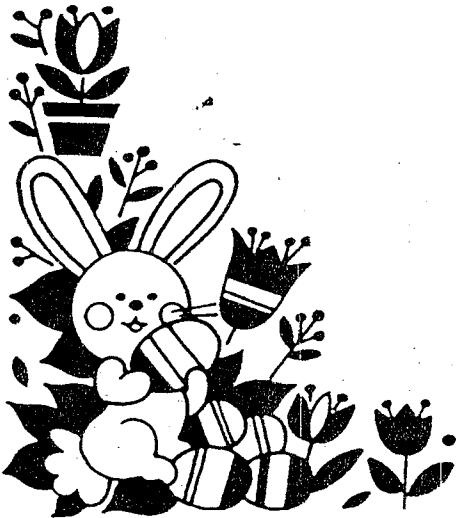
Well dear Friends I been a thinking about you pepole all winter been wondering how you all are and how Mr. is I did get a card from Maud I wrote Nellie a long time ago and never got a answer Well I hope this will find yous all well Thank God I am quite well in health But Oh My how lonesome I am with out those that is gone shure seems like ages to me But one thing I know is he has no suffering to do But Its been a long winter to me I am alone so much I guess you know I am keeping house for Effies 2 girls that go to high school And it Seemes as they are out every night one plays BasketBall they other one is practicing for a play her school to have soon But I shure been busy crocheying

for 2 ladies croched for one lace for 3 pecis her Mother lace for several pairs of pillow slips and vanity set lunch cloth. I am about out of thread now so I will have to quit peced up Effies quilt patches into a top have not seen her since Thanksgiving Roads been unpassable for Cars till this week they are out again Girls Father did not get in for 3 weeks then he came in a sled 2 weeks tomorrow since he was in They bring in eats from home Well it been a very cold winter was 39-40 below for Sometime 25 for several weeks so it took some coal we got a cold house But havent suffered their was several mornings I hated to get up to get they fires a going But I have not failed a morning as yet Ralph is here to so he went up on our home neighbourhood today to see about hay It been 30 above for a week But they last 2 nights been freezing quit hard Shure had a lot of snow And I have melted it ever since it Came I expect if it keeps nice I will be moving home So he can gets his things in shape for work Ralph was to see about a cook stove in Sadie neighbourhood Sometimes I think I am foolish to start up again but will try it this year see how it goes we ought to have quite a lot of moisture So much snow But shure are talking that grasshoppers are coming But I shure hope they keep away It has tried a good many Cares this winter they Spuds Effie sent in are frozen Makes me sick to have to cut them away Havreen noticed they first mess My these spuds got a whang on them I showed them to they could see for themselves So then Mamma mentioned about them in her letter My girls were all well last they wrote I usually hear from them once a week They remember me on My Birthday Berthas are still in Greenfield Iowa at his mothers place They notice they cold weather they lived in Ore. Well I hope your families are all in good health Flue been quite bad in this town I tool care of a Ladie between meals and I have not had it yet I dont go down town but very little And I am not in style I dont wear short hair nor dresses Still in they old style I think its no wonder they have colds they way they dress in winter no underwear to speak of But these 2 Laugh at me when I talk to them use to much trash on their completcion I hate to see them use so much they dont like it very well by spells one of these girls is shure dark

didnot use to be when small they oldest one not so bad But she has bad eye wears glases to shield it some Caused from Lancing a lump she had on her neck her hair used to be dark now its getting red and curley I tell her it looks good to me you know we have 4 with red hair Sadie has one girl red hair Annie babe looked as he would have red hair I Laughed and said I hoped he would One thing I hate in this hole if a few Ladies get together it is lets us play cards that shure makes me sore have card parties every night stay till morning then they hate to get up I see they are busy at our neighbours to night have several tables that is one thing never was played in our house only they last year Ralph used to play by themselves My I shure hated to see Katherine babe leave She hated it at they last to Well Merle did to But she writes about once a week Agnes dont have any little ones Ben does like children to They was going into a store But they pepole they were going in with had a fire lost their store So I am afaraid that is knocked on they head They had a nice bunch of cattle sold them last fall She worried now wondering what they are going to do Well Mrs Taylor I better stop for this time hoping to hear from some of you before long Remember me to all thats away from home and wishing you all a Prosperous Year I will close From a Old Friend
