

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## LaValley earns unique distinction

Long-time Liberty County resident, Glenn LaValley of Joplin, was honored by the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society during the Diamond Centennial celebration in Chester June 30-July 1-2 1995, commemorating

the 100th birthday of the Chester Post Office and 75th birthday of Liberty County.

Glenn, 75, had the distinction of being born nearest to the date of the founding of Liberty County, February 11, 1920 and according to the Genealogical Society, he's the only person born in the county at that time that has continued to reside here.

The son of Lawrence and Ida LaValley, Glenn is the third generation of LaValleys to farm on the homestead just north of Joplin. The first generation was his grandfather, Prosper, and the second generation to farm the land was Glenn's father, Lawrence.

With the exception of three years in the military, Glenn has spent his whole life working the land on the family farm. Married in March 1945, he and his wife Thelma have always lived in town at Joplin and Glenn commuted to the farm. They are the parents of three children Sherill, Randy and Susan and grandparents of nine grandchildren.

Both 1939 graduates of Joplin High School, he and his wife, recently celebrated their 50th anniversary on March 17th. "We've been together for ever," said Thelma, who grew up 11 miles north of Glenn.

When asked why he chose to stay in Liberty County, LaValley responded "Where else is there to go?! It's been my home all my life and we're satisfied." LaValley said living in Liberty County has its advantages over the city. "The weather here is just as good as anywhere," he and his wife agreed. "A lot of it is the people," said Glenn. "Where you know everybody within miles of you and they're your friends and neighbors - where a friend is a friend."

Glenn retired 11 years ago. His son-in-law Jim Coffman, Jr. now farms the LaValley farm. Glenn lists sitting, reading, gardening, fishing and hunting as hobbies.

## The Search was on for a Century Farm/Ranch in Liberty County

A couple of years ago Alice Shepherd a member of the Broken Mountains Genealogical Society came up with the idea of searching for a Century Ranch/Farm, with the help of Lyla Pugsley and Maxine Ward. They searched many sources, but were unsuccessful. So in the meantime we decided to look for a person born in Liberty County nearest to the County Birthday and still lives in the County. After locating a birthday person we received confirmation from the National Archives the end of May that there is in fact a rancher who does qualify for the Century Award. So we presented both awards. The Birthday Person was Glenn LaValley and the Century Ranch Award went to the Oswood Family.

B. J. Oswood's life-long hobby of saving things from the past has

strengthened the glue holding his family traditions together.

The importance of hanging on to his traditions was evident last weekend when he and his family received the Century Ranch award for their generation farm/ranch operation, given by the local Broken Mountains Genealogical Society. The honor was bestowed in conjunction with the Diamond Centennial celebration, for the verified farm or ranch that has been in existence since 1895.

Against the backdrop of the Sweet Grass Hills, the Oswood ranch is situated 23 miles northwest of Chester, at the foot of East Butte.

Including some state land, BJO Ranches, Inc. now totals 4,040 acres. Red Angus cross Herefords are raised there in addition to wheat and hay. Oswood also takes in other lease cattle in his operation.

Benjamin John, otherwise known as B.J., 53, has lived on the homestead of his grandparents John and Cecilia Oswood, for the past 33 years. His father Bennett, and Grandfather John all made their living on the same ranch. His grandparent's house, built in 1910, was the first home for B. J. and his bride, Michele, when they were married in 1962. According to accounts of the Oswood family history, the lumber for the house was brought to the ranch on wagons from Fort Benton.

The original house was built on the land sometime before 1900, and in later years, used as a barn.

In 1975 B.J. and Michele built a new home. Careful not to dispose of the past, they kept the old barn and house, including a great deal of his grandparent's housewares and some items from Norway, where B.J.'s grandfather originated.

Tucked among the keepsakes B. J. managed to hold on to through the years, right next to his dad's tickets for the Dempsey-Gibbons fight in 1923 at Shelby, are the original Abstracts of Title to his grandfather's properties, some signed by President William McKinley.

B. J.'s grandfather, John was born in Bergen, Norway and came to America in 1893, having lived first in northern Illinois before coming to Montana.

In the Spring of 1895 he and his brother Knute formed a partnership, pooling what money they had to buy 40 head of cattle. John also hired out to herd sheep, since he wanted to learn that aspect of business as well. In 1898 Knute got homesick and sold his share of the partnership to John, returning to Norway.

John became a government trapper when local ranches were losing calves to wolf-packs. He married Cecilia Risvod in 1899 and they had three children, Bennett, Margaret and Tillie. John started out with squatter rights until he could homestead and then continued to acquire land as he

went along, buying it up from other homesteaders.

Cecilia passed away in 1948 and John in 1957. B. J. remembers that he was 14 when his grandfather died.

John's son and B. J.'s father, Bennett Oswood, was born on May 22, 1900. He and his wife Beatrice and their children, B. J., Barbara and Berniece (interestingly, everyone's name in the family started with the letter B), lived on the farm that bordered John's place, four miles west, which was all one big unit, said B. J.

Buildings have been added over the years and an addition was made to the garage. The original root cellar, built in the 1930's is still in use.

Electricity wasn't hooked up on the farmstead until 1951.

A pond, artesian well that flows 24 hour a day and the beauty of the Sweet Grass Hills are special features of the ranch. B. J. remembers his grandparents used to keep cream and butter in a cement trough down in the well and the water would keep things cool.

Oats and hay for the horses were main crops in the early years. Wheat and barley came later when B. J. broke up the land in 1956 and started crops.

In 1976, B. J. bought the land from his father, Aunt Tillie Holm, sisters and step-mother.

He's been a farmer and rancher all his life, learning the ropes from his dad and grandpa. "From Day One I've loved it," he said.

It's been no small task managing to keep his operation afloat in these trying times for farmers and ranchers.

It's been rough to hang on to with bad prices on grain and cattle through the years and weather elements," said B. J. "But with lots of changes , we've survived," he added. "Oil and gas exploration, drilling and leasing have helped us," he added. Michele has helped quite a bit, too." he said with a smile. Very optimistic about the future, he feels "this might be one of the best years yet!"

The ranch has been a constant source of joy to the families that have lived there. "It's always been a gathering place." said B. J., "for all the neighbors to get together - these two places (his parent's and grandparent's homes) were always full of people."

Michele said she's always enjoyed the peace and quite of country living and the outdoors. Their two sons, Brett 26 and Bryan 22 had lots of friends out to stay when they were growing up. Brett is now employed in Great Falls but can be found at the ranch on most weekends. Bryan attends college at MSU-Northern and help out at the ranch during the summer months.

"It's been a good place to raise family," said the Oswoods, who all love

music and have many happy memories of "jamming together" on the ranch. "They (the Oswood ancestors) made friends through all the years and it was carried right on down," said B. J. fondly. "This is a good community, everyone helps one another out."

Another tradition in the Oswood family has been their livestock brand, which was passed down from John to his son Bennett and then again to his son B. J., who passed the N-9 brand on down to his son Bryan, to make it a four generation brand. Bennett had the B+O brand which he gave to B. J., who in turn gave it to his son Brett. BJ now has his own brand - BJO.

B. J. said that "saving things" always ran in his family, and he takes a lot of razzing for it, but has high hopes of saving and passing the ranch on down to his boys someday. As for him and his wife, "We'll stay here until we aren't able to," he said.

According to affidavits and other information gathered by members of the genealogical group, from the National Archives in Washington, D. C., the official date the Oswood ranch originated was May, 1895 -and a descendant of the Oswoods is still living on the very first piece of land purchased.

It is hoped to keep this award presentation as an annual project of the local Genealogical Society.

#### **Mrs. Oswood of Chester Passes Here**

Mrs. Cecelia R. Oswood, 67, Chester, pioneer resident in the Sweet Grass hills area, died at a local hospital Monday. She had a major operation last September.

Funeral services will be Friday afternoon at the Chester Lutheran church, with Rev. A. B. Holland of Fairfield officiating. Burial will be at Chester. The body is at Croxford's mortuary.

Mrs. Oswood was born April 7, 1880, in Sande, Norway and came to the United States in 1896. In 1898 she went into the Sweet Grass hills with her brother, Sivert Riswold. In 1899 she was married in Havre to John E. Oswood. In addition to her husband and brother in Chester she is survived by a son, Bennett, of Chester; two daughters, Mrs. Harold Holm, Great Falls, and Mrs. Margaret Gray, Seattle; a sister in Norway, and five grandchildren.

**JOHN E. OSWOOD**

Funeral services for John E. Oswood, 83, are being held in Chester, today, (Thursday) at Our Savior's Lutheran church at 2:00 p. m. Rev. Melvin K Frantzen, of the Hingham-Rudyard parish in charge. Mr. Oswood died in a Gt. Falls hospital Monday afternoon at 12:15.

John E. Oswood was born in Etne, Bergen, Norway, December 18, 1873. He came to the Sweet Grass Hills area in April, 1893 and has spent his life in that neighborhood. He worked on a sheep ranch until 1898 when he filed on a homestead. He married in that year to Celia Riswold, who preceded him in death in 1948.

He was engaged in stock raising from the time he filed on his homestead until the time of his death. From 1920 to 1930 he was official government trapper and pretty well cleaned the Sweet Grass Hills area of wolves and coyotes in that time.

He was the father of three children, all of whom survive. They are: Bennett, who lives on a ranch near the home place; Mrs. Harold Holm (Tillie), Great Falls; and Mrs. Margaret Grey, Seattle, Washington.

### **BERNETT OSWOOD**

Bennett was born May 22, 1900, on the old place near Haystack Butte, son of John and Ceceila Oswood. The year his father came to Montana in 1891, there wasn't much in Chester--no railroad or anything. Bennett saw his first built-in bathroom at the Bourne & Hamilton ranchhouse. His dad, John, bought his land from Bourne & Hamilton. B. & H. had to keep cutting down on their land until they no longer existed. Bennett spent most of his entire life in the Sweet Grass Hills. He attended Hill school and the Great Falls Commercial College. During the second World War he worked in the Navy yard. He married Beatrice Dolezal in Hingham, June 12, 1933. They had three children, Ben John (B. J.), Berneice and Barbara. Beatrice passed away 1957. He married Vetta J. Irwin Dec. 1963 in Salem, Oregon. Besides being the rancher of B & O ranch, Bennett was a horticulturist and for many years enjoyed the harvest of many and varied fruits. Bennett passed away May 9, 1975, in Chester.

**JOHN H. MORGAN**

Age 38

Liberty County Farmer

6 February 1930

JOHN H. MORGAN was born at Fort Benton, Montana, June 29th, 1891, he being 38 years, 6 months and 25 days of age. His father, Thomas Morgan, died when John was nine years old and his mother, Edith Brinkman Morgan, who later married Samuel DeYoung, passed away at Whitlash in 1914. He leaves to mourn his untimely death, his wife, Florence V. Morgan and daughter Wanda Zell, brothers Matt Morgan of Chester, Tom Morgan of Wilder, Montana; sisters Leatha Hanson, Chester and Mary Morgan Carroll at Devon, Montana; Alice DeYoung Burns and Gordon DeYoung, sister and brother by his mother's later marriage. John and Charles Brinkman, uncles and aunt May Branson at Kalispell. Tom Margan who lives about sixty miles from the railroad was unable to get to Chester for the funeral and Mrs. Branson was ill. Frank and Harry Nordstrom who live at Poison and Living Springs, Montana, were also unable to be present. Mrs. Ellen Irons a sister of Mrs. Morgan, with her husband, Logan came from Whitefish.

After the death of Mr. Morgan's father he lived for some time with his uncle, Henry Brinkman, on the Marias. In 1902 he moved to Whitlash and although of tender years was given the place of a man in the saddle and on the range. Altho of small stature he took the many hard raps of life along with the soft ones, like a man, standing up and with a grin.

On June 1, 1918 he enlisted at Havre and was shortly sent over seas to France, where according to his discharge papers, he took an active part in battles, engagements and expeditions and skirmishes. He was given an honorable discharge at Fort Russel, Wyoming, on June 23, 1919, with remarks of "excellent character with service". Honest and faithful. No A.W.O.L. or absence under G.O."

At the time of the creation of Liberty County, the convention selected John as Liberty County's first Sheriff. At the first election in 1920 he was elected for two years, and re-elected in 1922 and 1924, going out of office January 1st, 1927. For a young man without previous experience of any kind for the duties imposed upon him he made a remarkable record. His only failing, if such we may call it, was his kindheartedness.

After his term of office had expired he was immediately taken into the customs service, as a member of the border patrol, and it was in the exercise of these duties that he became fatally ill. Inhalation of gas during the war may have left its mark on him, but it did not seriously affect his health until exposures in below zero weather at Cut Bank laid him low in October, 1927. In April, 1928, he was admitted to the Veteran's hospital at Fort Harrison, and there was informed that pulmonary tuberculosis had gained great headway, but he put up a valiant fight to the last, passing away on Friday morning, January 24, 1930.

On September 12, 1923, he was united in marriage to Florence, V. Nordstrom and to this union was born a daughter, Wanda Zell, on March 17, 1927.

**JOHN H. MORGAN, HONORED CITIZEN OF LIBERTY  
COUNTY, CALLED TO GREAT BEYOND**

John H. Morgan, dearly beloved and highly honored citizen of Liberty County, of which he was the first Sheriff, serving for years with honor, passed away Friday night, January 24th, 1930, at the Veterans' hospital in Fort Harrison, after a lingering illness of two years. Mrs. Morgan, who had been hastily summoned from her home at Chester, did not reach his bedside before he had passed away. The remains were taken to Chester where the funeral services were conducted by the chaplain from the Fort. Despite the fact that all roads in the county are closed to any but traffic with sleds, the gathering of sorrowing friends was so large that many could not get inside the church. The floral offerings were in profusion and of the most beautiful design.

Rev. Pippie, former Chaplain at the hospital, Chaplain of the 163rd Montana Regiment who was with them in France and former resident of Chester, preached a most touching sermon coming from Helena for that purpose.

Friends came from all parts of the state. Col. Sheridan in charge of the Federal Customs office, and fifteen members of the Patrol of which Johnny was a member at the time he was stricken with tuberculosis were in attendance. From Havre there was Dan P. Hailey, H.C. Reuter and M. E. Bayham of the Havre office. John was a veteran of the World War and the American Legion conducted the rites.

John H. Morgan was born near Fort Benton and had spent all his years in

this immediate section, excepting the time given to his country's service during the War. We will have a complete obituary for next week's paper. He has passed on to his great reward, but his memory will ever be enshrined with loving thoughts for his noble character.

**CHESTER MAN DIES FROM BURNS**

Albin ZANDA, farmer near Chester, who was badly burned at his home June 6th, died June 19 at a Havre hospital. His burns had been very bad on his arms, less so on his body, but his system was unable to with stand the poison of infection. If he had lived he would have entirely lost the use of his hands. The burns were received when he attempted to light a fire with distillate.

Funeral services were conducted at Chester Wednesday afternoon, July 22, at 2 o'clock, with the Rev. John Stuart officiating.

Mr. Zanda was born on April 22, 1892, in Minnesota. He is survived by his wife, and daughter, Hazel aged two years. Also by four brothers. He has been a resident of Liberty County since 1912, when he homesteaded in that vicinity.

**EARLY RESIDENT OF CHESTER LAID TO FINAL REST**  
**Active Business Life Comes To A Close**

E. A. (Al) Engstrom was born in Sweden November 29, 1878, and came with his parents to the State of Mississippi where his father died when young

Al was three years of age, and when a young man of 21 came to Montana and was employed in various capacities around the city of Lewistown, coming to Chester at the age of 21 and became identified with the ranchers in and around the Sweet Grass Hills; being in the employ at different times of Frank Laird, T. P. Strode and others in those parts

Becoming interested in business enterprises in Chester, he opened a garage and automobile business here in 1914 in which he was engaged up to the time of his death.

On December 13 he was united in marriage to Miss Sarah Parish who survives him, and to this union four children were born - John, a daughter that died in infancy and Sidney and Stanley. Two sisters also survive, one in Mississippi and one in Illinois.

He passed away at the Deaconess Hospital in Great Falls Sunday morning at 8 o'clock and funeral services conducted from the Community Hall at Chester under the stately service of the Brotherhood of Odd Fellows, following which the remains were laid to rest in the local cemetery. The crowds that turned out to pack the hall must have numbered more than 400 persons. Blocks of seats were reserved to the Rebeckahs, the Theta Rhos and the members of the order and flowers and songs attest the general regard.

Al Engstrom was a thoughtful man, his judgement and keen insight, was quiet but penetrating, and charged with a rare courage of conviction made his advice eagerly sought even by those with whom he differed. The foundling and the unfortunate felt the warm glow of his restless but sympathetic heart - another rugged pioneer disappears from whence he came - into the unknown - followed by the respect and esteem of the entire community.

### **WATCHDOGS OF SOCIAL SAFETY GATHER AT BIER OF DEAD COMRADE**

Events in the recent crisis of the KEITH family leading up to and immediately following the death of the late MILAM KEITH, exposed the strong bands that unite men of the Secret Service.

Arriving at Spokane, his brother, Dodds Keith, found no duties left to perform; his own comfort and convenience having been anticipated and provided before his arrival.

Funeral arrangements and preparations for shipment had been well made, and two special guards were ready and accompanied the remains to the old home in Chester.

These quiet and low voiced men forgot, for the time, their clues and quarries, in their desire to care for the earthly departure of one of their own. These guardians of public safety were drawn from the ranks of the Highway Patrol, from the Revenue Service, uniformed Border Police as well as sheriffs and deputies from neighboring counties, and the corps of Great Northern Policeman who were conspicuous by their number and who carried the remains to and from the church and to the grave. For the last time they bent their tall forms and broad shoulders to look upon a fellow worker.

A sense of potential power featured the ceremonies as Rev. John B. Stuart, himself a railroad man, took the pulpit. His diction followed a divine promise as truly as the road of iron wheels follow the rails - in his syllables the mellow clang of a sincere regard, and his few gestures were measured with sorrow - for a time the thunder and roar of iron engines was muted with regret.

Among the officials from the Secret Service of the Great Northern who attended were Tom Bailey, special officer in charge of the Seattle-Spokane Division and H. A. Hollingsworth. They were special officers in charge of the body, on its way from Spokane to Chester. Pall Bearers were Arthur Zebarth and Charles Neilson of Shelby, Fred Petterson of Whitefish and W. S. Hamilton of Havre.

Honorary Pallbearers were: M. J. Wegner, Chief of Special Agents of the Great Northern from St. Paul, M. Sydness of Whitefish, Montana; G. R. Roundy of Havre, Montana; O. Nicholson of Great Falls, Montana; Andy Holst of Glasgow, Montana; R. C. Timmons, George Johnson, Lyle Clark, Leon Davidson, M. E. Simpson, A. Fredrickson, Hans E. Jensen, Robert Smith and Dave Osborne, all of Shelby; and Cecil Aisop of Snelby, Montana; M. A. Gerspacher, also of Shelby.

For more than 20 years the above officers worked with Milam Keith as Special Agents of the Great Northern Railway.

Among the boyhood friends of the deceased who knew him years ago were John Raiter, Gt. Northern Agent at Brady who went to school with the deceased when they were boys in Chester in 1903 and 1904. Art Loranger and wife, of Havre, also a school mate in Chester. Sam Murray and wife, friends of the Falls. Mr. and Mrs. Howard Sailor and Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Williams of Havre, and many railroad friends.

MILAM KEITH born at Sharon, Texas February 27th, 1892, and in his early youth moved with his parents to Montana where he has since made his home. 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## **ANN MAE HANSON - PAT LUDWIG TO INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION**

In July Anna Mae Hanson and Pat Ludwig traveled to Bismark, North Dakota to attend the 25th Anniversary International Convention of the German's from Russia Heritage Society. The convention was held at the Radisson Inn and was hosted by the Dakota Pioneer Chapter. The theme for this year's convention was "Preserving Our Heritage-Enriching Our Lives." There were numerous workshops, but the most popular room was a full library of materials pertaining to genealogy of the Germans who were among the groups of people who went to Russia and started over 200 villages, often naming them after the communities they had left in Germany. Within this room were sections of people working on particular villages offering suggestions, readings, and other research. Also in this room were hundreds of obituaries, group and family sheets, community books with write-ups on various families, passenger lists, etc. This room was open much of the time and participants flocked to it when ever there was a spare moment.

The workshops were varied and very helpful. They started out with a glimpse into Canadian Roots, giving tips on how to get started. The second workshop of the conference looked at some of the ramifications of the computer world using the networks and digital libraries. Professor Roger Ehrich talked about exploring full-text retrieval systems and even provided disks to look into this. He gave a more advanced workshop the next day. This was all very interesting and a look at what the future holds for genealogists who do use the computer for their research.

To help us understand "Village Research" Dale Wahl gave a background and some tips on using them. He also was looking for others to work as coordinators for some of the villages that are not being serviced at this time. Both Pat and Anna Mae were able to trace ancestry back to a particular village, primarily through the aid of Dale and Gwen Pritzkau. Gwen not only gave a workshop, but she also worked individually with people in the Gluckstal Colonies. Anna Mae was able to get help on her Bittner line and also she joined that particular association and is now receiving their newsletter and more assistance. Pat's relatives were in a book called Wittenberg and she was able to go three generations back and may eventually be a coordinator for that village.

A very moving presentation was given by Elvera Reuer, who with her

family was forced to flee ahead of Russian armies. She spoke of the harrowing experiences as they went from one place to another including refugee camps, etc. until they were able to come to the United States in 1949. She spoke passionately about the freedoms we have and declares herself an American citizen by choice.

Other workshops, special speakers at the meals, and optional slide presentations helped to make this convention a very memorable event. The hosts were gracious and very helpful and the meals, themselves, were great. There were relaxing moments when the participants were served kuchen and beverages, and little extras including singing, dancing, a textile exhibition, a rug weaving demonstration, and a full interdenominational church and memorial service.

There were also stolen moments to do research at the North Dakota Historical Society and a few opportunities to try some of the close by fast food establishments. A stop in Mandan and Medora rounded off this travel opportunity.

Do not rely on someone's word or only one document as proof. Too many genealogists rely on too little evidence. Take death documentation for instance. Aunt Sally may remember that Uncle Jake died on a certain date, but that should only be a start in your quest for correct information. There are family Bible records, the death certificate, mortician's records, cemetery records, obituaries and the Social Security death record and application, and these are just records for the demise of Uncle Jake !! Since memories are not always accurate, and since mistakes are very common on documents of all kinds, a good genealogist has to gather a lot of evidence. Proof is the accumulation of good evidence.
